

HEALTHY WORKERS, HEALTHY WISCONSIN

The **Healthy Workers, Healthy Wisconsin** project launched in 2017 with a five-year award from the Wisconsin Partnership Program at the UW School of Medicine and Public Health. This pilot project aims to improve the health, resilience & economic well-being of residents in some of the poorest & most economically isolated communities in Wisconsin.

Specifically, **Healthy Workers, Healthy Wisconsin** aims to improve the health & well-being of participants by combining:

- Employment services
- Health insurance coverage with primary care physician visits
- Trauma screening with referral to behavioral health services

Healthy Workers, Healthy Wisconsin builds on the Public Policy Institute's long history with Transitional Jobs. PPI was a driving force behind the Transitional Jobs Demonstration Project in the 2009 state budget, as well as the subsequent Wisconsin Families Jobs Act, which lifted the cap on Transitional Jobs.
