2009

Transitional Jobs Become a Reality

The Wisconsin budget includes an amendment drafted by PPI's David Riemer that creates the Transitional Jobs Demonstration Project authorizing up to 2,500 jobs. The subsequent Wisconsin Families Jobs Act lifts the cap on transitional jobs. PPI helps to found the Milwaukee Transitional Jobs Collaborative.

2015-2017

Release of Working Our Way Out of Poverty Policy Package

After years of development and testing,
PPI launches this work-based policy
package that will greatly reduce poverty.
US Senator Tammy Baldwin of Wisconsin
& Senator Cory Booker of New Jersey
introduce The Stronger Way Act,
inspired by PPI's proposal.

2008

Community Advocates Public Policy Institute Launches

PPI secures funding for the Milwaukee Addiction Treatment Initiative, a partnership to expand affordable, accessible addiction treatment.

Wildflower Communities funds the Mental Health Policy Project, a collaborative effort to ensure the availability of mental health services in Milwaukee County.

2010

Insurance Parity Victory

Gov. Jim Doyle signs the Wisconsin Addiction and Mental Health Parity Law, strongly supported by PPI and allies.

2011-present

Prevention Work Expands

PPI expands its reach by convening prevention-related coalitions and initiatives targeting positive youth development, reduced tobaccouse, substance abuse prevention, anti-violence efforts, smart reentry after incarceration, minority male achievement & transitional jobs.

2018

Healthy Housing Initiative

PPI celebrates its first decade with the Healthy Housing Initiative, a multifaceted campaign to improve affordable housing and residents' health & well-being.
